Summary

A career-ending injury doesn't keep a promising athlete from making a great contribution to his community and becoming a force for positive change. When everything Stone had worked for is taken away, he chooses to forgive. What to Watch for While Viewing

Key Questions

1. What were the choices Stone had after his injury?
2. How would Stone's life be different if he had made a different choice?
3. What are the boys learning from Stone?
4. How is Stone modeling leadership?

Grades 9–12:

What to Watch for While Viewing

When things work against us, it's easy to feel upset and even take our feelings out on other people. In this video, you will learn about a man who responded positively to a very disappointing event in his life. As you watch, think about how you would respond to the same situation.

Key Questions

1. How would Stone's life be different if he had made a different choice?
2. What are some of the leadership skills Stone is teaching the boys?
3. How is he modeling leadership?
4. Is there a way for you to model leadership to a younger person?

Application

Ask, "How can you use what you learned in your own life?"

Lead students to recognize:

- We are in charge of our life.
 - What we think affects what we do.
 - Our behavior serves as a model for others.
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
